PRAIRIE CONEFLOWER

Prairie Coneflower is a summer perennial that attracts butterflies and songbirds. It grows to 3 or more feet when mature. Five to eight yellow petals surround a brown/black seed disc to create a cone shape. The Prairie Coneflower can be found growing in prairies, roadsides and the margins of wooded areas.

Planting Instructions	Site preparation is vital for allowing your seed to make clean contact with the soil, allowing for successful and uniform germination. Start with a clean, firm, weed-free seedbed to allow for uniform seed placement and an increased chance for faster establishment.
